Dues Info & Note to BA's

The International Office increased the basic monthly dues by \$1 effective January 1, 2019. "A" dues are \$41/month and "BA" dues are \$22/mo.

Most "BA" members are unaware that there is another type of membership with additional benefits offered by the IBEW. Whether you are working for a Contractor, Co-op or Municipal, you may change your ticket from a "BA to an A" Member. The benefits of being an "A" member, include an additional Pension through the International Office, additional life insurance policy, and most locals require an "A" ticket if you are traveling for storm. The life insurance policy pays out \$6,250 for natural causes and \$12,500 for accidental death and dismemberment. If you are interested in switching your membership from a "BA" to "A" member please call the Union Hall for more information.

Ready to Retire?

Are you getting ready to retire? If so, please contact Memory at the Union Hall to get your retirement applications at least 3 months before you plan to retire. If you need help filling out the applications, please be sure to call to make an appointment with Memory and she will gladly help you get them filled out.

Health Reimbursement Account

Employer contributions into your Health Reimbursement Account are at the rate of \$0.35/hr under the 6-876-A agreement. Your HRA must accumulate \$100.00 to trigger your BENNY CARD to be issued.

Shoen's Spot

Brothers and Sisters,

There is something I would like to talk about that is tools and inspection and or test dates. Hopefully all of you know that there are tools we use all most every day that need to be inspected and tested on a regular basis.

Mechanical jumpers, Grounds, Hot Sticks, (shot guns, switch sticks etc.) All have a one-year test date.

Boom test, DOT inspection, one year

Rubber gloves and sleeves, 120 days they need to be inspected before every use!

Rubber Blankets 9 months, remember not to use Black Tape instead of (close pins) There is a chemical in the adhesive that cannot be cleaned off so that blanket will not pass an electrical test. Rubber hoses no date on testing but if they look warn or are discolored or cracking remove from service.

Your Fire Extinguisher has a one-year test date on Also it needs to be inspected every month with the initials of the inspector on the card next to the month.

Hard Hat Liners should be replaced every year, the Hard Hat every 5 years.

Bucket trucks need to have a tested liner in the bucket.

First Aid kits need to be looked at and refilled if need be.

Another reminder it takes two qualified workers to work anything over 500 volts.

All apprentices shall be in direct supervision by a Journeyman. That means direct contact not Journeyman on the ground and the apprentice in the air or watching through the windshield of the truck. That is Albat standers!

I do realize that our Co-ops and Municipal the rules are different. So, with that being said learn your rules and live and work by them. Rules were put into place because there was an accident and someone was injured.

Let's stay safe and be our Brothers Keepers and all go home safe.

Marijuana Legalization?

Recently Michigan legalized the recreational use of Marijuana, however you need to be aware that it still against federal law. This include Federal D.O.T. laws, so for the apprentices out there if you test positive, you will likely lose your CDL, and could lose your apprenticeship.

This will be the same for any of the positions through Local 876, if you can't pass a drug screening you can't get a referral. **Your Career** is much more important than bad decisions, so please don't make bad decisions.
